China Student Blames U.S.

Tried to Halt His Return To Red Homeland

TOKYO, Aug. 20.—(INS)—A Chinese nuclear scientist who returned to Red China from the United States was quoted by Peiping Radio today as saying American authorities attempted

to block his return at each port of call en route. The scientist is Dr. Chia Lin Hsieh who continued on to China last month after mysteriously scrapping plans to skip

ship at Yokohama and head back for the United States. He received his doctor's de-gree at Stanford University, Palo Alto, Calif., in 1951, and

later worked in the microwave

laboratory there.

Doctor Hsieh was one of twenty-six Chinese students who returned to Red China via Hong Kong aboard the liner

President Wilson.

When the ship docked at Yokohama, July 25, it was learned that in mid-voyage he had asked the purser to aid him in returning to the United States. But when newsmen in-terviewed him aboard ship he said he wanted to go on to China and was not being coerced.

Peiping radio quoted him as saying he had received a telegram at Los Angeles saying his sister in Seattle was ill, but there was no cause for alarm

over her condition. The Red radio claimed that nevertheless, American officials tried at Yokohama, Manila and Hong Kong to get him to return to the United States.
