

M'ARTHUR AID FOR IKE URGED

WASHINGTON, Nov. 1. — (AP)—Senator McCarthy (Republican of Wisconsin) proposed today that President Eisenhower call in General Douglas MacArthur as a "special presidential advisor on Far-Eastern affairs."

McCarthy made his suggestion in a statement sent to the Senate press gallery.

"Today there is an additional reason for summoning General MacArthur's services," McCarthy said. "Due to his unfortunate illness, President Eisenhower is not now able to carry, personally, the full burdens of his office.

"In view of the continuing crisis in the Far East, the President's task would be immensely facilitated if he and his advisors had the benefit of the daily counsel of this wise man and seasoned area expert."
