POLICE ACT TO FND RUNAWAY **GAR DANGFRS**

Illegally Parked Autos Tagged As Crackdown Is Enforced

A special police traffic unit returned to the scene of Thursday's runaway truck accident yesterday to enforce a renewed crackdown on vehicles dangerously parked.

Under direct orders from Acting Police Chief George Healy the traffic detail toured portions of Leavenworth, Taylor and Mason Streets and issued fifteen citations for improperly parked vehicles. Healy acted after receiving

complaints about dangerously parked automobiles and trucks from residents near where the

runaway truck free wheeled down a sidewalk on Leaven-worth Street Thursday. The heavy van sideswiped a parked auto, struck two more cars and an elderly woman and narrowly missed a group of playing children before it halted its roll between Jackson and

its roll between Jackson and Washington Streets.

The traffic detail issued four citations on Leavenworth, between California and Bay Streets; eight on Taylor, between California and Market Streets, and two on Taylor, between California and Market Streets, and two on Taylor, between California and Market Streets.

The citations were issued

The citations were issued under traffic regulations which require automobiles to be parked with wheels cramped to

parked with wheels cramped to the curb, handbrakes set, and the vehicle in gear. The cita-tions carry a \$10 fine. The crackdown first was or-dered after a runaway moving van ran wild on Clay Street on May 27, killing seven persons in-cluding the driver. Since then there have been a number of instances of runaway vehicles instances of runaway vehicles on hills in which several persons were injured.
