State Fair to Show Biggest Atomic Exhibit on Record

SACRAMENTO (Examiner Bureau), Aug. 7.—The biggest atomic exhibit ever constructed will be built for this year's California State Fair and Exposition, it was announced today.

The huge display, prepared by the American Museum of Atomic Energy at Oak Ridge, Tenn., will take up a third of the floor space available in the fair's industrial building.

One feature of the exhibit permits visitors to have coins made harmlessly radioactive to take home as souvenirs.

The 1955 fair and exposition opens September 1 and will close September 11.

In other developments, plans for a "marriage of State waters" in a huge fountain on opening day were well underway.

Communities from all sections of the State plan to supply water from their areas.

The Yreka Chamber of Commerce will haul water from the Marble Mountain area by pack train for the festivities, and the Calistoga Chamber said it will supply water from the California Hot Springs.

Tank trucks will bring water representative of the Sacramento area, and outboard motor boats will bring several casks of Kutras Lake water for the ceremony.

Horse racing will be held each day of the fair except Sundays and the feature event will be the \$20,000 Governor's Handicap.

There also will be free daily vaudeville shows at 1 and 4 p. m. in the Outdoor Theatre.
