The doctors returned from attending medical symposia at United States Naval hospitals

The presence of Doctor Crenshaw, who is chief of thoracic surgery at the Contra Costa Hospital in Martinez, was the deciding factor instigating the operation, the first of its kind ever performed in the Marianas.

The patient, Lana Neja, is a native of Majuro, Marshall Islands, and was flown to Guam with her mother. Her father is a seaman on an inter-island

schooner.
