

Proposal Made for Joint U. S., China Peace Move

LONDON, Nov. 7. — (AP) — the release of prisoners and other issues between the two countries. The Communist Daily Worker reported today Red China has proposed to the United States a joint declaration renouncing the use of force.

There was no official confirmation of the report.

In a dispatch from Geneva, the newspaper said Red China Envoy Wang Ping-nan made the offer there on November 3 during the ambassadorial talks on

The proposal was said to have been coupled with a renewed call for a meeting between United States Secretary of State Dulles and Chou En-lai, the Red China Premier and Foreign Minister.

United States Ambassador U. Alexis Johnson countered Wang's offer with the demand

that the declaration renouncing the use of force specifically cover Formosa, the dispatch said.

The United States Embassy and British Foreign Office refused to comment on the story, saying it was a matter for the United States State Department.
