

POLIO STUDY AT UC PRAISED

DENVER, Nov. 5.—(INS)—Basil O'Connor, president of the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis, had high praise today for two University of California scientists who have discovered how to crystallize pure polio virus in a test tube.

O'Connor said the discovery, announced Thursday by Drs. Charlton E. Schwerdt and Frederick L. Schaffer, represents an important development in the long fight to control and eventually wipe out the dread disease.

However, he warned that despite the discovery and recent success of the Salk anti-polio vaccine, the fight against polio had not yet been won.

O'Connor said more than 68,000 persons were still in United States hospitals recovering from polio attacks. Additional research on the Salk vaccine, he added, was continuing in laboratories across the Nation.
