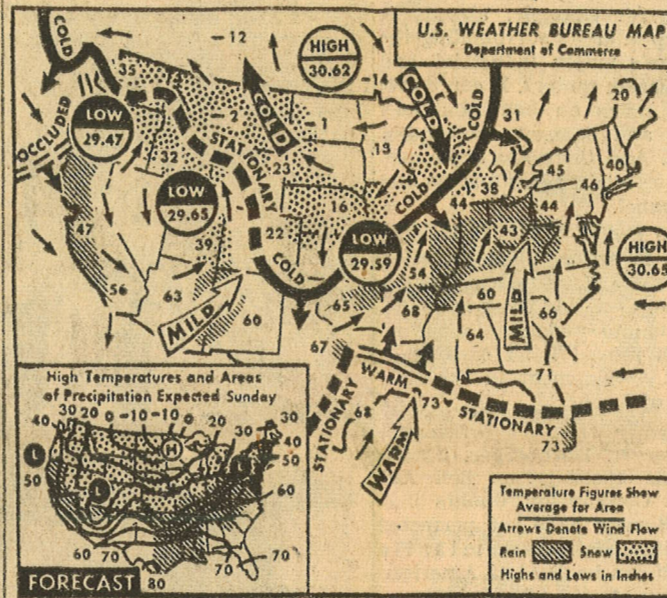


Complete Weather and Shipping Reports



WEATHER FORECAST—Precipitation over most of the United States will be general today, with snow due in northern New England, upper New York and the northern Plains, also in the northern and central Rockies westward to the Northwest Pacific States. South of these areas it will rain. In California and the Southwest desert region, rain is also likely. Temperatures will fall from Maine to the Dakotas and southward to the southern Plains, mid-Mississippi Valley and southern Rockies.

San Francisco Bay Region—Intermittent rain today and tomorrow. Showers tomorrow. Little change in temperature. High today San Francisco, Oakland, San Mateo and San Rafael 50-55. Low tonight 38-44. Westerly winds 20-30 miles per hour today becoming northwesterly tomorrow.

Northern and Central California—Intermittent rain on coast and in valleys and snow mountains above 2,000 feet today and tonight. Showers today except snow in mountains. West and southwest winds 20-30 miles per hour becoming northwest tomorrow.

Nevada—Snow and colder northern and central portions and occasional rain southern portions today and tomorrow. Windy. High today 20-32; Northern 25-35; Central and 45-58 extreme south. Low tonight 12-25 except 30-55 extreme south.

Mt. Shasta-Siskiyou area—Snow today and tonight. Occasional snow tomorrow. Continued cold. Windy at times.

Sierra Nevada—Snow today and tonight. Occasional snow tomorrow. Colder today. Strong southwesterly winds today and tonight.

Sacramento Valley—Intermittent rain today and tonight. Showers tomorrow. Little change in temperature. Southerly winds 20-30 miles per hour today becoming northwesterly and decreasing tomorrow. High today 47-53; low tonight 38-42.

San Joaquin Valley—Intermittent rain today and tonight. Showers today and tomorrow. Slightly cooler today. Windy northern portion today. High today 48-53; low tonight 38-44.

Salinas Valley—Intermittent rain today and tonight. Showers tomorrow. Slightly cooler today. Southerly winds 10-20 miles per hour tonight and today becoming northwesterly tomorrow. High today 50-55. Low tonight 38-42. Low today 38-42. High today 44 and 51; Paso Robles 39 and 52.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 26.—(AP)—Veterans were reminded yesterday that any Veterans Administration benefit payments they have received need not be counted in figuring their Federal income taxes.

Death benefits to families of deceased veterans also are exempt from Federal taxation, said an announcement from the Veterans Administration and Internal Revenue Service.

Oakland Missionary, Wife Sail for Korea 'Home' Today

A doctor and his wife, who twenty-six years ago chose to serve God by helping others, sail for "home" today.

"Home" for Doctor and Mrs. George H. Rue is Seoul and Pusan in Korea where they have been medical missionaries since 1929.

On the steamship China Transport with them are ten tons of clothing, bedding, toys, books and other articles destined to delight 350 children in the orphanage directed by Mrs. Rue at the hospital in Seoul.

STATION WAGON.

A station wagon and two new trucks plus \$6,000 worth of medicines are also aboard.

With hard work and help from the Seventh-Day Adventists back home he managed to open a larger hospital at Seoul in 1936, only to be forced out during the Japanese invasion.

He re-opened this hospital with 135 beds in 1946. For the following two years Doctor Rue worked sixteen hours a day and longer seeing patients and performing surgery on hundreds of Koreans, many of them refugees from North Korea.
