

# State Department Aides in S.F., Seeking Applicants for Jobs in Capital and Overseas

The call of faraway places will seem a little louder for San Francisco's secretaries and clerks today when Department of State personnel begin two weeks of interviews seeking applicants for overseas jobs.

The interviews, conducted at the Federal Building, will be for persons between 21 and 35 years of age for overseas work at any of the Nation's 265 embassies, legations and consulates scattered about the world.

For those seeking employment in Washington, D. C., the minimum age limit is 18. Stenographers must type forty words a minute and take dictation at eighty words a minute. Salaries range upwards from \$3,415 a year.

Personal interviews will be given from 9 a. m. to 5 p. m.
