The friendship between Truman and Albert Chow dates from the 1945 United Nations conference here a few weeks after Truman became President on the death of Franklin D. Roosevelt.

Chow, a former president of the Chinese Six Companies, powerful Chinatown family organization, and a former director of the Chinese Chamber of Commerce, has been an important local figure for many years.

He has extended Chinatown's official greetings to such notables as Madame Chiang Kaishek on frequent occasions and has made several visits to the Orient in recent years. A vigorous opponent of the Chinese Communist regime, his visits included conference with Chiang Kaishek on Formosa.

He had free-wheeling entree to the White House while Truman was president and during a 1950 visit to San Francisco, Truman stopped a parade from Revenue Service.
