

Rear-end Collision Prevention Idea

BOSTON.—Most rear end collisions could be avoided if the driver would stay far enough behind the driver ahead says the Massachusetts division of the American Automobile Association.

Here's a handy rule to remember says A.A.A.: At least one car length for every ten miles on your speedometer—twenty m.p.h., two car lengths; forty m.p.h., four car lengths; sixty m.p.h.—six car lengths.
