

British Utilize Radio Education

LONDON.—More British school children than ever before are listening to radio broadcasts as part of their lessons.

Three-quarters of all the schools in Britain now listen to one or more of the British Broad-

casting Corporation's broadcasts each week. The number of schools registered as regular listeners totals nearly 28,000.

Programs catering to elementary and secondary school children include nature study talks, travel talks, stories from world history, music and English lessons, and talks on current affairs.
