

35 Million State College Funds Asked for Fiscal Year

SACRAMENTO, Nov. 9.—The State department of education is seeking nearly thirty-five million dollars to operate the ten State colleges during the 1956-57 fiscal year.

The total, up 29.4 per cent over the current year's budget, is to be submitted tomorrow to the State department of finance.

Additional support funds are required, the education department says, to take care of a full-time enrollment of 48,000, an increase of 8,943 students over the 1955-56 years.

The increase also includes 1,122 new positions, 537 of them new professors and instructors.

Finance department spokesmen said the colleges' building

requirements have not been decided and the capital outlay budgets will not be brought up for some time. 1956-57 enrollment estimates and budget requests:

Chico, 2,400, up 400, \$1,667,943; Fresno, 4,560, up 340, \$2,319,841; Humboldt, 1,300, up 200, \$1,436,099; Long Beach, 4,400, up 1,200, \$2,479,704; Los Angeles, 6,800, up 2,000, \$3,931,546; Sacramento, 3,200, up 550, \$2,221,740.

San Diego, 6,200, up 747, \$3,811,736; San Francisco, 6,028, up 396, \$3,885,414; San Jose, 9,200, up 690, \$5,962,649; Cal Poly, 5,216, up 2,044, \$4,230,346, and the California Maritime Academy near Vallejo, 150, up 9, \$9,315,225.
