

# Yardstick in Starlight

MADISON (Wis.).—Completion of a spectrograph designed specifically for use with a photoelectric cell may mark the beginning of a period of greater accuracy in measuring radiation from stars.

The photoelectric spectrograph was developed by the University of Wisconsin astronomy department. The device was perfected in connection with a program of research at the University of Wisconsin in which photoelectric cells have replaced photographic plates in measuring stellar energy.

Unlike the photographic plate, the photoelectric cell will respond directly to the intensity of light.
