

Examinations Set for U. S. Positions in Bay Region

The following Federal jobs in the Bay area will be filled by examination, the United States Civil Service Commission announced yesterday.

Safety inspector, \$3,670 to \$5,440 a year, in the bureau of motor carriers, Interstate Commerce Commission. Successfully completed college study in transportation or mechanical engineering may be substituted for all the experience required for the minimum paying positions.

Savings and loan examiners, \$4,525 to \$5,440 a year plus travel and subsistence allowances. Appointees will be headquartered in Los Angeles or Portland and audit savings and loan associations in western cities.

Sandblaster, \$1.87 an hour, and helper machinist, \$1.79 an hour, in Navy and Marine Corps construction work in the Bay area.

Correctional officer, \$3,670 a year, for duty on Alcatraz and at San Pedro. No experience is required. A written test is scheduled for mid-August because of the extreme shortage of men in this position.
