

# 3-Day Science Symposium Will Open Tonight at U. C.

A three day symposium on the physical and earth sciences will open tonight in Berkeley on the University of California campus, with a lecture by Joel Hildebrand, president of the American Chemical Society.

Hildebrand, emeritus professor of chemistry at California, will review the accomplishments of chemical research at Berkeley during the last twenty-five years.

His talk will begin at 8 p. m. in Wheeler Auditorium.

Tomorrow night, again at 8 o'clock, Ernest O. Lawrence, inventor of the cyclotron and director of the radiation labora-

tory, will describe UC research in physics.

Otto Struve, astronomy department chairman and retiring president of the International Astronomical Union, will speak Wednesday evening.

Speakers for afternoon sessions tomorrow and Wednesday will include Perry Byerly, director of seismological stations, and Roger Revelle, director of the Scripps Institution of Oceanography, La Jolla.

The three day meeting was arranged as a tribute to the twenty-fifth anniversary of Robert Gordon Sproul as president of the university.

Sessions will be open to the public.
