

Flyer Falls Out of Plane At 8,000 Feet; Just Seasick

HAMILTON (Bermuda) April 29. — (AP) — A United States Air Force Weather observer fell through the bomb bay doors of a B-29 flying 8,000 feet above the sea today. His only complaint was seasickness on the boat that rescued him.

Capt. Wallace Taylor of San Bernardino, Calif., stationed at Kindley Airfield, was on a routine flight thirty-five miles northeast of Bermuda this morning. He told rescuers that he went to the bomb bay to check a possible fuel leak and

the next thing he knew he was whirling through the air.

He pulled the ripcord of his parachute and made an easy landing on the water. He had both a Mae West lifejacket and a one man life raft.

Taylor was unable to say how he got out the bomb bay doors. Presumably he accidentally kicked the opening lever.

The base crash boat encountered twenty foot waves and a thirty-five mile wind when it plucked him from the sea.
