U.C. Stadium Shift Studied

The university-city liaison committee of the Berkeley planning commission met yesterday to consider the feasibility of relocating the University of California's Memorial Stadium and Edwards Field on the city's submerged tidelands.

The special meeting was called after the planning commission voted to consider the relocation at its Wednesday night meeting.

Such a move, City Planning Director James Barnes said, would allow for ample parking space that is at present lacking in the vicinity of the two campus properties.

"The removal of the football stadium and the track and baseball field would greatly reduce the need for the university to expand beyond its present campus," Barnes said.

Barnes also told the planners that architects and engineers of the university have studied the relocation project and consider it "economically feasible."
